
Minister's Awards

The Minister for Education, Training and Skills, **the Honourable Blair Boyer**, and **Educators SA** want to celebrate you and your success as an educator.

The prestigious 2025 Minister's Awards offer a unique opportunity for you to be acknowledged by the Minister and your peers, and to receive a financial award that allows you to increase your impact within our education community. This financial award is provided so that you can design and pursue some amazing professional learning that will help you be and become an even more outstanding educator in your learning community.

What are the Minister's Awards? There are three different categories of Awards:







In each category there are opportunities for educators from all three sectors to be celebrated (Public Education, Catholic Education, Independent Sites).

What - Where - When

How can you get involved?

- Read the Award information and think about how well you, your colleague or your Preschool fits the criteria. Get excited about the possibilities it might offer you and others!
- Consider your professional learning proposal and discuss applying for the award with your Line Manager/Principal. Are they prepared to support your application?
- Submit an online application by Monday, 8th of September, 11pm

What do I receive?

A beautiful Award to show off, and an **\$8 000 grant** for professional learning to enhance your personal/site capacity in your particular field.

When and where are the Awards presented?

As an awardee, you will attend the Educators SA State World Teachers' Day Awards evening on Friday 31stOctober, 2025 at Adelaide Oval where you will have the chance to celebrate with the education community and receive your Award from the Minister.

Public School Category

• Teacher of the Arts in their first five years of teaching*

Preschool Arts Education Award

 This award is presented to a site, not an individual and is open to any Public Education preschool (school based, stand-alone or a Children's Centre)

Minister's Awards for Excellence in Financial Education

Public School Category

- Primary Teacher or Leader
- Secondary Teacher or Leader

Non-Government School Category

• R-12 Teacher or Leader

Minister's Language Immersion Scholarships

Public School Category

- R-12 Language Teacher
- Early Career Language Teacher in their first five years of teaching*

Non-Government School Category

- R-12 Language Teacher in a Catholic school
- R-12 Language Teacher in an Independent school
- Early Career Language Teacher (Catholic or Independent) in their first five years of teaching*

^{*} NOTE: For Early Career Teacher Awards, the first five years of teaching can include TRT, contract and ongoing appointments.

Award Criteria

Am I eligible?

To be eligible for the Individual Awards, applicants must:

- Be a practicing teacher (or Leader) in SA in the field of the Award
- Not have previously won an Award in the same category
- Have the support of your Principal/Director/Line Manager
- Be intending to teach/lead in that field and sector in 2026
- Be able to, with the support of your site, undertake the planned professional learning during the 2026 calendar year

To be eligible for the **Preschool Arts Award** your site must be a Public Education Preschool – standalone, school based or a Children's Centre.

How are the Awardees selected?

A panel comprised of representatives from Educators SA, the Department for Education, non-government education sectors and relevant Professional Associations will assess the applications. The panel will consider your:

- Eligibility
- Responses to the application questions
- Supporting endorsements
- Current CV (2 pages maximum)

Educators SA may also:

- Seek feedback from your Principal/Director/Line Manager for quality assurance processes
- Invite you to meet with the panel online for a short discussion to clarify aspects of your application

Recommendations from the Panel are endorsed through the Board of Educators SA and all applicants are notified of the outcome of their application in September.

Expectations

If I'm successful, what are the expectations?

If successful you must:

- Be able to attend the Educators SA World Teachers' Day award ceremony which will be held on Friday 31stOctober, 2025 at Adelaide Oval. At this event you will receive your Award from the Minister for Education, Training and Skills and be celebrated by your peers.
- Consent to your name and image being used by Educators SA, the Department for Education, CESA or AISSA by completing a relevant consent form
- Be willing to be filmed and/or talk with the media for the purpose of marketing the awards as required
- Share your professional learning with colleagues in a format to be negotiated between you and Educators SA
- Carry out the planned professional learning program in the 2026 calendar year. Any revisions to your intending learning programme are to be approved by the Chief Executive of Educators SA.
- Submit a short report to Educators SA by the end of the 2026 calendar year summarising the outcomes of the professional learning and a financial acquittal.





Individual Awards

PURPOSE

The awards are designed to:

- Acknowledge and celebrate the valuable contribution made by outstanding Arts Educators
- Celebrate the role of Arts Education and its place in the community
- Identify Arts Educators who are creative and innovative in guiding their children and young people to realise their potential
- Provide opportunities for outstanding teachers of The Arts to engage in quality professional learning in The Arts

THE AWARDS

The awards provide \$8 000 for each Awardee to undertake professional learning that is designed to allow them to further develop and innovate their practice and leadership in The Arts. A maximum of \$2 000 can be allocated to TRT backfill in the proposal.







Preschool Award

PURPOSE

This award is designed to:

- Acknowledge excellent practice in Arts Education in a Public Education
 Preschool in any one or combination of the Arts forms; dance, drama, media
 arts, music and visual arts. This might include one or a combination of the
 following:
 - Integrating arts provocations in the preschool's play programme
 - Integrating one or more Artforms as a specific programme of play provocations
 - · Collaborating with artists in the preschool learning environment
 - Working as a preschool team to undertake professional learning in the Arts and then putting this new learning into practice and having an impact
 - Other great Arts ideas, practices or initiatives

THE AWARD

The award provides \$8 000 to a preschool to further develop and implement its Arts programme. This could include acquiring resources, undertaking staff professional learning, hosting artists, sharing their Arts practices with other preschools, engaging their community in the Arts or other relevant professional activity that enhances their Arts programme. A maximum of \$4 000 can be allocated to TRT backfill in the proposal.









PURPOSE

The awards are designed to:

- Acknowledge and celebrate the important role financial literacy plays in ensuring that children and young people can thrive
- Celebrate the role of teachers and leaders who act as innovators in this aspect of learning and teaching
- Identify and recognise educational leadership and quality innovative classroom practices in financial education
- Provide opportunities for further scholarship in financial education supporting the design and delivery of effective and meaningful programs, courses, subjects and other initiatives shining a spotlight on financial education in schools

THE AWARDS

The awards provide \$8 000 to allow each Awardee to undertake professional learning that is designed to allow them to further develop and innovate on their practice and leadership in Financial Education. It may include formal study at a tertiary institution; travel and observation of identified classroom practice within Australia; teacher release to develop and trial new courses or subjects within a school; teacher release to influence collegiate practice within a network of schools.



What does the scholarship involve?

This scholarship provides the awardees with the opportunity to use the \$8 000 to undertake one of two types of in-country study programmes:

- Personal in-country immersion
- Immersion programme within Australia

Applicants are asked to propose their own immersion programme that focusses on improving their language skills and proficiency, and intercultural understanding. Applicants are required to establish a detailed itinerary and budget plan to support their proposed personal in-country immersion programme as part of the materials for the panel to consider. Immersion scholarships are only available for languages that have a curriculum or framework in the Australian Curriculum. Depending on the applicant pool, the scholarship programme will aim to cover a range of languages in each funding cycle including Asian, European and Australian languages.

Key criteria to consider

Key criteria to consider when developing your proposal for an immersion programme:

- How will it improve your language skills and proficiency and intercultural understanding?
- How will you use what you learn within your teaching practice?
- How will you use what you learn to impact on the learning and teaching of other language educators?
- What impact, short and long term, will your immersion experience have on student engagement and retention in Languages at your site?


A maximum of \$2 000 can be allocated to TRT backfill in the proposal.
